Prime Minister of Nepal and Chief Adviser of Bangladesh Meet on the Margins of UNGA

Prime Minister of Nepal Rt. Hon. Mr. K P Sharma Oli had a meeting with Chief Adviser of the Interim Government of Bangladesh H.E. Professor Dr. Muhammad Yunus on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly on 25 September 2024 in New York.

They exchanged views on strengthening Nepal-Bangladesh relations and discussed ways to enhance energy and transit cooperation, tourism, cultural exchanges, educational ties, and cooperation in regional and multilateral forums. In particular, they took stock of the economic engagements and emphasized the need to expeditiously realize power trade between the two countries.

Ambassador Calls on the Chief Adviser

Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari called on Chief Adviser of the Interim Government of Bangladesh H.E. Professor Dr. Muhammad Yunus at the latter's office in Dhaka on 17 September 2024.

On the occasion, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari congratulated the Chief Adviser on his appointment and handed over to him the letter of felicitations from the Prime Minister of Nepal Rt. Hon. K P Sharma Oli.

The Chief Adviser appreciated the expression of support and solidarity from Nepal and observed with

satisfaction that the two countries continue to enjoy close and cordial relations both at the political and people-to-people levels.

During the meeting, discussions were held on ways to further consolidate Nepal-Bangladesh relations with a renewed focus on economic linkages.

The Ambassador thanked the Bangladesh government for support and cooperation received in matters related to safety and security of Nepali nationals, particularly Nepali students, during and after the protests in July and August.

Senior officials from the Chief Adviser's Office and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bangladesh were present on the occasion. Ambassador Mr. Bhandari was accompanied by Deputy Chief of Mission Ms. Lalita Silwal and Second Secretary Ms. Yojana Bamjan.

Swearing-in Ceremony of the Interim Government

On 8 August, Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari attended the swearing-in ceremony of the Chief

Adviser Professor Dr. Muhammad Yunus and Advisers of the newly formed interim government of Bangladesh.

President H.E. Mr. Mohammed Shahabuddin administered the oath of office and secrecy to the Chief Adviser of the Government Dr. Yunus and 13 other advisers of a 17-member 'Advisory Council' amidst a ceremony organized at Bangabhaban, the President's office.

On the occasion, the Ambassador had an opportunity to congratulate and extend best wishes to the Chief Adviser. He also greeted President Shahabuddin on the occasion.

'Meet and Greet with Diplomatic Corps' Hosted by the Chief Adviser

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari attended the 'Meet and Greet with Diplomatic Corps' hosted by Chief Adviser of the Interim Government of Bangladesh H.E. Prof. Dr. Mohammad Yunus on 18 August.

This was the first interaction between Dr. Yunus and the diplomatic community in Dhaka since he assumed office on 8 August.

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari also spoke briefly with the Chief Adviser. He appreciated the efforts of the interim government in restoring normalcy in Bangladesh and extended best wishes to Dr. Yunus and his team on behalf of the Government of Nepal. Dr. Yunus referred to the 'excellent friendship' between Nepal and Bangladesh and sought "Nepal's support in the efforts of his government to navigate through the current transitional period".

Call on the Foreign Affairs Adviser

Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari called on Adviser for Foreign Affairs of the Interim Government of Bangladesh H.E. Mr. Md. Touhid Hossain on 3 September.

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari extended hearty felicitations to Hon. Adviser on his appointment and handed over to him the congratulatory letter from Minister for Foreign Affairs of Nepal Hon. Dr. Arzu Rana Deuba.

During the meeting, discussions were also held on ways to further strengthen Nepal-Bangladesh relations.

Hon. Foreign Affairs Adviser expressed satisfaction over the state of excellent bilateral relations between the two countries and underscored the need to increase trade and economic engagements for the mutual benefit of the two countries.

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari emphasized the importance of harnessing potentials in areas such as trade, investment, tourism, energy, education, and people-to-people contacts, among others.

Diplomatic Briefing by the Foreign Affairs Adviser

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari attended a diplomatic briefing hosted by the new Foreign Affairs Adviser H.E. Mr. Touhid Hossain held at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on 12 August. This was his first diplomatic briefing since the formation of the interim government led by Nobel Laureate Prof. Dr. Mohammad Yunus, following the resignation of former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on 5 August.

During the briefing, Foreign Affairs Adviser updated the diplomatic community on the situation in Bangladesh and outlined the steps being taken by the interim government to restore law and order and bring back normalcy in the country. He urged the international community to continue their support as the country navigates through the transitional period.

Meeting with Adviser for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari called on Adviser for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources of Bangladesh H.E. Mr. Muhammad Fouzul Kabir Khan on 8 September.

The Adviser expressed satisfaction over the excellent state of bilateral relations and acknowledged the close friendship existing between the two countries since the establishment of diplomatic ties. He

conveyed his eagerness to collaborate closely with Nepal, particularly in realizing the power trade between the two countries.

During the meeting, they discussed the progress made in bilateral energy negotiations and agreed to expedite the process of power trade between Nepal and Bangladesh including by early signing of the power sales agreement on the export of 40 MW of power from Nepal to Bangladesh through the Indian transmission lines.

Meeting with Adviser for Home Affairs

During the meeting, Ambassador underscored the harmonious relations between Nepal and Bangladesh since the establishment of diplomatic ties. The Adviser acknowledged Nepal's early recognition of

Bangladesh after the latter's independence. He expressed satisfaction over the close socio-cultural ties with Nepal and the diverse areas of cooperation between the two countries.

Meeting with Adviser for Environment, Forest and Climate Change

On 29 September, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari called on Adviser for Environment, Forest and Climate Change of Bangladesh H.E. Ms. Syeda Rizwana Hasan.

They exchanged views on strengthening Nepal-Bangladesh cooperation in the sectors of energy, climate change and environment. They also discussed the ongoing preparations of Hon. Adviser's upcoming visit to Nepal.

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari thanked the Adviser for her acceptance to visit Nepal to witness the first ever power trade agreement to be signed by Nepal, Bangladesh and India.

The Adviser expressed satisfaction over the friendly relations and diverse areas of cooperation between the two nations. She expressed happiness in being a part of this important occasion and emphasized the importance of the trilateral agreement in the sub-regional cooperation in the sector of clean energy.

Meeting with Adviser for Health and Family Welfare

Ambassador Ghanshyam Bhandari called on Adviser for Health and Family Welfare of Bangladesh H.E. Ms. Nurjahan Begum on 29 September.

They discussed various aspects of Nepal-Bangladesh bilateral relations, with a particular focus on cooperation in education, health and medical tourism. Detailed discussion was also held on the concerns and issues of Nepali medical students studying in Bangladesh.

Meeting with State Minister for Cultural Affairs

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari called on the State Minister for Cultural Affairs of Bangladesh H.E. Ms. Naheed Ezaher Khan on 8 July.

During the meeting, they exchanged views on matters of mutual interest including ways to further strengthen the cultural cooperation between Nepal and Bangladesh at the people-to-people level.

The State Minister stressed the need to preserve the historical scripts and archives of Nepal through digital means and appreciated the efforts of Nepal Embassy for promoting Nepal's tourism and culture in Bangladesh. Ambassador Mr. Bhandari recalled the deep-rooted and time-tested historical and cultural linkages between Nepal and Bangladesh.

They also discussed the need for early commencement of the construction of a Buddhist Monastery in Lumbini by the Government of Bangladesh.

countries, characterized by strong ties at both the political and people-to-people levels. He reiterated the commitment of the Government of Nepal to collaborate closely with the Government of Bangladesh to further expand trade and economic linkages between the nations.

10th Anniversary of the Establishment of BIMSTEC Secretariat

On 13 September, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari attended the tenth anniversary of the establishment of the Secretariat of the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) in Dhaka.

The event was attended by Md. Touhid Hossain, Foreign Affairs Adviser of Bangladesh's Interim Government as the Chief Guest, while Ambassadors and High Commissioners from BIMSTEC member states were present as special guests.

Welcoming the dignitaries, BIMSTEC Secretary General Indra Mani Pandey highlighted the Secretariat's crucial role in executing regional cooperation initiatives. In his address, Chief Guest Md. Touhid Hossain commended BIMSTEC's significant progress in promoting shared goals and interests across the Bay of Bengal region.

Speaking on the occasion, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari underscored that BIMSTEC symbolizes the

collective identity connecting South and Southeast Asia and represents our common desire to tap into the rich natural, cultural, and human resources of our countries for socio-economic development. While he underlined the need to revitalize the BIMSTEC process with renewed resolve, collective commitment and concerted actions, he expressed Nepal's commitment to promoting cultural ties, touristic links and people-to-people contacts among the member states in a spirit of mutual benefit and cooperation.

Presentation of a Report on MDB

On 2 September, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari attended a session organized by the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) to discuss the findings of a study titled "How Relevant is the Multilateral Development Bank (MDB) Reform Discourse for Southern MDBs? Evidence from Country-Level Practices."

The study investigates how Southern MDBs can enhance their effectiveness in supporting graduating Least Developed Countries (LDCs) amidst the challenges of a poly-crisis. It specifically examines why Bangladesh and Nepal, as two graduating LDCs, may find Southern MDBs to be suitable development partners and identifies key reforms that could be beneficial.

Speaking on the occasion, the Ambassador appreciated the launching of the report and

highlighted the crucial importance of ODA for LDCs, particularly the graduating ones. In light of the potential loss of international support measures, it is critical that the MDBs channelize their assistance to these graduating LDCs in the latter's priority areas, he stressed.

Facilitation of the Travel of Nepali Students

Amidst the 'quota reform movement' marked by clashes between the protesters and the law enforcement agencies, the Embassy closely monitored the situation and remained in close contact with the government agencies and the relevant educational institutions hosting Nepali students.

On 17 July, the Embassy issued a notice advising Nepali students to stay indoors and adhere to the instructions of their respective university and college administration. They were advised to contact the Embassy in case the college authorities ask them to leave their hostel due to security concerns and/or the situation at their accommodation is deemed unsafe. The Embassy team also visited some colleges and universities in Dhaka to take stock of the safety and security situation of Nepali students.

The Embassy facilitated the return of over 2,100 students to Nepal via air and land border points. It also facilitated their travel to the airport for those flying from Dhaka and coordinated with the local authorities to ensure police protection for those travelling via land route.

Virtual Interaction with Nepali Students

Amidst the reports of violent protests in Bangladesh during the months of July and August, the Embassy continued to prioritize the safety and security of Nepali nationals, particularly Nepali students.

The Embassy officials held several virtual interactions to discuss safety and security concerns. While many Nepali students had already safely returned to Nepal, approximately 400 Nepali

students, mostly intern doctors, remained in Bangladesh.

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari along with the Embassy officials joined the virtual interactions and addressed several queries and concerns of the students.

The students were also informed on how the Embassy had been facilitating the safe return of Nepali students who wished to return to Nepal via air and land border points. Several queries of the students regarding the security situation, documentation and attestation related concerns were also addressed during the interactions.

Meeting with Adviser for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources
